HO-CHUNK NATION LEGISLATURE HO-CHUNK NATION FAMILY VIOLENCE PREVENTION AND SERVICES GRANT PROPOSAL RESOLUTION 2-26-08 C

- WHEREAS,** on November 1, 1994, the United States Secretary of Interior approved a new Constitution for the Ho-Chunk Nation, formerly known as the Wisconsin Winnebago Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the Ho-Chunk Nation ("Nation") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe, organized pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2 (a) of the Ho-Chunk Nation Constitution ("Constitution") grants the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature ("Legislature") the power to make laws, including codes, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2, (i) of the Constitution authorizes the Legislature to negotiate and enter into treaties, compacts, contracts, and agreement with other governments, organizations, or individual; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2 (s) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to promote public health, education, charity, and such other services as may contribute to the social advancement of the members of the Ho-Chunk Nation; and
- WHEREAS,** the Ho-Chunk Nation tribal members who experience domestic abuse are at physical and emotional risk and require protective supportive services; and
- WHEREAS,** the Ho-Chunk Nation Department of Health & Social Services works with the Nation's tribal members who are experiencing domestic abuse in the planning, implementing and evaluating effective strategies designed to meet protective and supportive services and initiating the process of recovery as a victim.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature renders its full support of the 2009-2009 Ho-Chunk Family Violence Prevention and Services Grant Application submitted to the Administration for Children and Families to effectively address the protective and supportive services of those Ho-Chunk tribal members experiencing domestic abuse through the implementation of effective interventions that focus on each Ho-Chunk Nation tribal member's unique needs.
