RESOLUTION 12-09-08 D**

- WHEREAS,** on November 1, 1994, the Secretary of the Interior approved a new Constitution for the Ho-Chunk Nation, formerly known as the Wisconsin Winnebago Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the Ho-Chunk Nation (Nation) is a federally recognized Indian Tribe, pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(a) of the Constitution ("Constitution") grants the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature ("Legislature") the power to make laws, including codes, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(i) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to negotiate and enter into treaties, contracts, compacts, contracts and agreements with other governments, organizations or individuals; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(r) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to protect and foster Ho-Chunk religious freedom, culture, language, and traditions; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(s) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to promote public health, education, charity, and such other services as may contribute to the social advancement of the members of the Ho-Chunk Nation; and
- WHEREAS,** the American Indians Against Abuse ("AIAA") is a non-profit organization, comprised of tribally appointed board member representatives from the eleven tribes of Wisconsin.
- WHEREAS,** the AIAA is developing a Coalition Website that will use the Ho-Chunk Nation tribal seal on the AIAA Website and other AIAA promotional materials to better promote the Domestic Abuse Program services of the Ho-Chunk Nation.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature renders its full support of the American Indians Against Abuse Coalitions use of the Ho-Chunk Nation tribal seal for use of better promoting the Domestic Abuse Program.

CERTIFICATION
