**HO-CHUNK NATION LEGISLATURE
GRANTING CONSENT AS AN INTEREST HOLDER
TO THE JAMES WILSON HOMESTEAD # 441-200 FOR A
BIA RESIDENTIAL LEASE FOR ROGER R. YOUNGTHUNDER
RESOLUTION 5-04-10 A**

- WHEREAS,** on November 1, 1994, the United States Secretary of the Interior approved a new Constitution for the Ho-Chunk Nation, formerly known as the Wisconsin Winnebago Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the Ho-Chunk Nation ("Nation") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2 (a) of the Ho-Chunk Nation Constitution ("Constitution") grants the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature "Legislature" the power to make laws, including codes, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2 (i) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to negotiate agreements with other governments, organizations, or individuals; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2 (l) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to enact laws to manage, lease, permit, or otherwise deal with the Nation's lands, interests in lands or other assets; and
- WHEREAS,** the Nation does hold interest, acquired through (ILCP) Indian Land Consolidation Program, in the property known as JAMES WILSON HOMESTEAD # 441-200, located in the NE ¼ NE ¼, Section 32, Township 22 North, Range 3 West, 4th P.M., Komensky Township, Jackson County, Wisconsin, containing 40 acres more or less; and
- WHEREAS,** the Nation is being requested to give consent for a residential lease on this property, which shall consist of one parcel, 1-2 acres, more or less, and not more than one dwelling to be authorized on said parcel. Easements for access and utility purposes shall be authorized; and
- WHEREAS,** the Lessee(s) shall have and hold the parcel for a term of twenty-five (25) years, with an automatic renew for an additional twenty-five (25) years; and
- WHEREAS,** the Nation authorizes the United States Secretary of the Interior to grant the lease with payment of rent or other compensation waived; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature is hereby granting its consent for the entire portion of the Ho-Chunk Nation's purchased heirship interest to the Bureau of Indian Affairs for the purpose of issuing a 1-2 acre residential lease on the JAMES WILSON HOMESTEAD # 441- 200 to ROGER R. YOUNGTHUNDER.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Roger R. Youngthunder will abide by all guidelines established by the Ho-Chunk Nation Department of Housing and Ho-Chunk Nation Register of Deeds Office.
