**HO-CHUNK NATION LEGISLATURE
APPROVAL OF THE HO-CHUNK NATION
RFP FOR PROJECT ADMINISTRATOR: KIJIRE NAGU HEALING CENTER**

**RESOLUTION 11-08-11A
(Defeated Resolution)**

- WHEREAS,** on November 1, 1994, the United States Secretary of the Interior approved a new Constitution for the Ho-Chunk Nation, formerly known as the Wisconsin Winnebago Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the Ho-Chunk Nation ("Nation") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe, pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(a) of the Ho-Chunk Nation Constitution ("Constitution") gives the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature ("Legislature") the power to make laws, including codes, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(b) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to establish Executive Departments, and to delegate legislative powers to the Executive branch to be administered by such Departments, in accordance with the law; any Department established by the Legislature shall be administered by the Executive; the Legislature reserves the power to review any action taken by virtue of such delegated power; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(d) of the Constitution grants the Legislature to authorize expenditures by law and appropriate funds to the various Departments in an annual budget; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(f) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to set the salaries, terms and conditions of employment for all governmental personnel; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(i) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to negotiate and enter into treaties, compacts, contracts, and agreements with other governments, organizations, or individuals; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(x) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to enact any other laws, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes necessary to exercise its legislative powers delegated by the General Council pursuant to Article III including but not limited to the foregoing list of powers; and

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WHEREAS, the Ho-Chunk Nation seeks to provide positive benefits to its membership including healing services by taking a proactive approach to total wellness; and

WHEREAS, General Council Resolution #10-11-03J approved the development and creation of a healing center for the sole purpose of "securing our future generations' health and well being;" and

WHEREAS, the Legislature passed Resolution 11-17-09M which provide that the Legislature pursuant to its constitutional authority, will financially support the Nation's efforts to complete the Healing Center project securing our future generations health and well-being; and

WHEREAS, the Ho-Chunk Nation Tax Code authorizes the allocation of up to 25% of the revenues collected under the Code to be utilized for the creation of a Ho-Chunk Nation Healing Center for Addiction; and

WHEREAS, the next step in making the Kijire Nagu Healing Center a reality is to hire a project administrator to create and write the program for the operational development planning phase which may include, but is not limited to, conducting strategic planning, program development, and policies and procedures for the Center.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature authorizes the distribution of a Request for Proposal to firms and consultants to serve as the Project Administrator for the completion of the next phase of planning for the Kijire Nagu Healing Center.
