

RESOLUTION 3-03-09 N**

- WHEREAS,** on November 1, 1994, the Secretary of the Interior approved a new Constitution for the Ho-Chunk Nation, formerly known as the Wisconsin Winnebago Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the Ho-Chunk Nation ("Nation") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe, organized pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(a) of the Ho-Chunk Nation Constitution ("Constitution") grants the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature ("Legislature") the power to make laws, including codes, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(s) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to promote public health, education, charity, and such other services as many contribute to the social advancement of the members of the Nation; and
- WHEREAS,** the Ho-Chunk Nation tribal members who are under the age of eighteen (18) need the assistance of services, should they be incarcerated; and
- WHEREAS,** the Ho-Chunk Nation Division of Social Services is applying for a Program Planning Grant to explore the need for a tribal youth detention center for our troubled youth; and
- WHEREAS,** the Program Planning Grant will demonstrate the need to develop program goals and objectives to retain cultural identity for youth detained in a Tribal Youth Detention Center

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature, pursuant to its Constitutional authority fenders full support for the 2009-2011 Correctional Facilities on Tribal Land Program submitted to the Bureau of Justice Assistance to effectively address the needs of our Ho-Chunk youth if they should be placed in a correctional facility.

### CERTIFICATION

I, the undersigned, as Tribal Secretary for the Ho-Chunk Nation, hereby certify that the Legislature of the Ho-Chunk Nation, composed of 11 members, of whom 7 constituting a quorum were present at a meeting duly called and convened and held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of March, 2009, that the foregoing resolution was adopted at said meeting by an affirmative vote of 7 members, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining, pursuant to the authority of Article V, Section 2(a) and (x) of the Constitution of the Ho-Chunk Nation approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 1, 1994, and that said resolution has not been rescinded or amended in any way.
