**HO-CHUNK NATION LEGISLATURE
HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AGENCY'S
2009 ARRA-PUBLIC FACILITIES ICDBG CHILDCARE PROJECT
RESOLUTION 6-03-09 B**

- WHEREAS,** on November 1, 1994, the United States Secretary of the Interior approved a new Constitution for the Ho-Chunk Nation, formerly known as the Wisconsin Winnebago Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the Ho-Chunk Nation ("Nation") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe, organized pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(a) of the Ho-Chunk Nation Constitution ("Constitution") grants the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature ("Legislature") the power to make laws, including codes, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes; and
- WHEREAS,** the Ho-Chunk Nation and Ho-Chunk Housing and Community Development Agency ("HHCDA") have received a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) from HUD for the FY2009 ARRA-Indian Community Development Block Grant (ICDBG) Program, through which affordable-housing, infrastructure/public facilities, and economic development activities can be funded, with the Nation as the applicant; and
- WHEREAS,** HHCDA and the Ho-Chunk Nation have determined that there is a great need for additional and more affordable childcare services in the HCN Black River Falls Area, available to low-income HCN and other AIAN residents of HHCDA's communities, in addition to a need of those residents for additional economic development activities, to help improve their standard of living; and
- WHEREAS,** in order to help meet the essential community needs for affordable childcare and economic development in the HHCDA Black River Falls affordable housing communities (Jackson County, Wisconsin), HHCDA plans to construct a childcare center on HCN trust Land adjoining the HCN Executive Building and the Ho-Chunk Health Care Center, near the HHCDA housing communities-the "Ruxton Property"; and
- WHEREAS,** the planned Childcare Center will be set up to become an independent 501(c) (3) nonprofit agency, with its own governing board and staff, employing area tribal members both in the construction and operational phases (through HHCDA and HCN will provide resources to help establish the agency), with a goal of eventually providing childcare spaces for all low-income AIAN members in the area who are in need of this service; and
- WHEREAS,** HHCDA was awarded an FY 2008 ICDBG grant of \$600,000, toward the construction of the childcare project, to which amount the Nation cash-matched \$150,000; and
- WHEREAS,** the HHCDA Board of Commissioners has made a commitment to assist the to-be-created childcare nonprofit agency with ongoing in-kind support, including grant-writing support, to insure stable and cost-efficient operations and financial management and support, and maintenance and operational assistance until such time as the childcare center attains self-sufficiency.

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NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ho-Chunk Nation renders its full support of the ICDBG grant application seeking \$600,000 of FY 2009 ARRA HUD ICDBG funds, prepared by HHCDA, on behalf of the Nation, to expand the affordable childcare project to serve the full needs of the Nation community in the Black River Falls area, and of other AIAN people in the area, through the HUD Office of Native American Programs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Ho-Chunk Nation commits \$150,000 in cash and additional in-kind support to the ICDBG project, to the childcare project, giving a total project funding of \$1,500,000 (\$600,000 2008 ICDBG + \$600,000 2009 ARRA ICDBG + \$150,000), in addition to HCN and HHCDA in-kind match of staff, land, time, resources, office space, and supplies, with the provision that this additional HCN cash match is contingent upon receiving the ARRA ICDBG award from HUD; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the President of the Ho-Chunk Nation be authorized to sign all certification assurances and other forms accompanying the ICDBG application.

CERTIFICATION

I, the undersigned, as Tribal Secretary for the Ho-Chunk Nation, hereby certify that the Legislature of the Ho-Chunk Nation, composed of 11 members, of whom 8 constituting a quorum were present at a meeting duly called and convened and held on the 3rd day of June, 2009, that the foregoing resolution was adopted at said meeting by an affirmative vote 7 members, 0 opposed, and 1 abstaining, pursuant to the authority of Article V, Section 2(a) and (x) of the Constitution of the Ho-Chunk Nation approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 1, 1994, and that said resolution has not been rescinded or amended in any way. I further certify that this is a verified copy of said resolution.
