HO-CHUNK NATION LEGISLATURE PASSING AMENDMENTS TO THE *LEGISLATIVE ORGANIZATION ACT (2 HCC § 11)* RESOLUTION 6-10-09 B

- WHEREAS,** on November 1, 1994, the United States Secretary of the Interior approved a new Constitution for the Ho-Chunk Nation, formerly known as the Wisconsin Winnebago Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the Ho-Chunk Nation ("Nation") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe, organized pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(a) of the Ho-Chunk Nation Constitution ("Constitution") grants the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature ("Legislature") the power to make laws, including codes, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(f) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to set the salaries, terms and conditions of employment for all governmental personnel; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(g) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the authority to set its own procedures, select its officers, and to enact laws governing attendance of its members, including penalties for absences; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(i) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to negotiate and enter into treaties, compacts, contracts, and agreements with other governments, organizations, or individuals; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(x) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to enact any other laws, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes necessary to exercise its Legislative powers delegated by the General Council pursuant to Article III including but not limited to the foregoing list of powers; and
- WHEREAS,** the Legislature enacted the *Legislative Organization Act (2 HCC § 11)* by Legislative Resolution 2/13/01D; and
- WHEREAS,** as a result of the Special Election for Redistricting held on November 18, 2009, certain provisions of the *Legislative Organization Act* need to be amended to reflect the results of that Special Election; and
- WHEREAS,** these amendments include:
- (a) Changing the number of Legislators necessary to satisfy the quorum requirement to hold legislative session;
 - (b) Changing the number of Legislators necessary to satisfy the quorum requirement to hold Finance Committee meetings;
 - (c) Changing requirements with respect to filling absences on the Administration or Development Committees; and
 - (d) Changing the number of Legislators that must be absent to enact the provisions of Chapter V with respect to "Continuity of Government" when faced with a loss of Quorum due to the death or incapacitation of Legislators resulting from natural or manmade disasters; and

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WHEREAS, there have also been proposed a substantive changes to the *Legislative Organization Act*; and

WHEREAS, these proposed amendments would provide more rules to govern various aspects of District meetings; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature referred these proposed amendments to the Administration Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Administration Committee reviewed the proposed amendments and motioned for the *Legislative Organization Act* to be sent to Legislature for it to be placed out for forty-five day public comment; and

WHEREAS, the *Legislative Organization Act* controls the process for amendments to laws of the Nation; and

WHEREAS, section 31, subparagraph d (1) (a) of the *Legislative Organization Act* provides that the Public Review period will typically be forty-five days; and


WHEREAS, the Legislature passed Resolution 4-07-09 E to place the amendments out for forty-five day public comment, which ended as of May 25, 2009.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Legislature, pursuant to its Constitutional authority passes the amendments to the *Legislative Organization Act* (2 HCC § 11); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that these amendments to the *Legislative Organization Act* shall only be effective July 1, 2009.
