HO-CHUNK NATION LEGISLATURE APPROVAL OF ROAD MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT RESOLUTION 5-20-08 E

- WHEREAS,** on November 1, 1994, the United States Secretary of the Interior approved a new Constitution for the Ho-Chunk Nation, formerly known as the Wisconsin Winnebago Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the Ho-Chunk Nation ("Nation") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe, organized pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(a) of the Ho-Chunk Nation Constitution ("Constitution") grants the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature ("Legislature") the power to make laws, including codes, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(b) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to establish Executive Departments, and to delegate legislative powers to the Executive branch to be administered by such Departments, in accordance with the law; any Department established by the Legislature shall be administered by the Executive; the Legislature reserves the power to review any action taken by virtue of such delegated power; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(d) of the Constitution grants the Legislature to authorize expenditures by law and appropriate funds to the various Departments in an annual budget; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(f) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to set the salaries, terms and conditions of employment for all governmental personnel; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(i) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to negotiate and enter into treaties, compacts, contracts, and agreements with other governments, organizations, or individuals; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(l) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to enact laws to manage, lease, permit, or otherwise deal with the Nation's lands, interests in lands or other assets; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(m) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to enact laws to prevent the sale, disposition, or encumbrance of Ho-Chunk lands, or other Ho-Chunk assets; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(o) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to enact laws to regulate and zone any lands within the jurisdiction of the Ho-Chunk Nation; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(x) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to enact any other laws, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes necessary to exercise its legislative powers delegated by the General Council pursuant to Article III including but not limited to the foregoing list of powers; and

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WHEREAS, the Midwest Regional Office of the Bureau of Indian Affairs informed President Wilfrid Cleveland that additional funds are available to the Ho-Chunk Nation to perform IRR Road Maintenance Activities; and

WHEREAS, the Midwest Regional Office provided the Ho-Chunk Nation with a copy of its "Standard Contract Format" for Road Maintenance; and

WHEREAS, the "Standard Contract Format" describes the terms, conditions, provisions, and program standards to perform IRR Road Maintenance Activities; and


WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs requires a Tribal Resolution authorizing the Nation to enter into the Standard Contract.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature, pursuant to its Constitutional authority, approves the P.L. 93-638 Road Maintenance Agreement (Contract No. CTF55T43996); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature, pursuant to its Constitutional authority, authorizes President Wilfrid Cleveland to sign P.L. 93-638 Road Maintenance Agreement.
