HO-CHUNK NATION LEGISLATURE REPROGRAM TRIBAL PRIORITY ALLOCATIONS RESOLUTION 12-7-10 O

WHEREAS, on November 1, 1994 the Secretary of the Interior approved a new Constitution for the Ho-Chunk Nation, formerly known as the Wisconsin Winnebago Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Ho-Chunk Nation is a federally recognized Indian Tribe pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934; and

WHEREAS, Article V, Section 2(a) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to make laws, including codes, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes; and

WHEREAS, Article V, Section 2(d) of the Constitution of the Ho-Chunk Nation grants the Legislature the power to authorize expenditures by law and appropriate funds to the various Departments in an annual budget; and

WHEREAS, the Ho-Chunk Nation has three categories of Tribal Priority Allocations from the Bureau of Indian Affairs: (a) Fee to Trust Memo of Understanding, (b) Indian Child Welfare, and (c) Education: (Adult Vocational Training, Johnson O'Malley, Higher Education); and

WHEREAS, the Great Lakes Agency of the BIA has available 2011 Base Program Allocations for the Ho-Chunk Nation. The BIA has requested the reprogramming of funds from the "Consolidated Tribal Government" code for distribution; and

WHEREAS, Available Program Allocations are calculated to be: (a) Fee to Trust Memo of Understanding to \$215,000, (b) Indian Child Welfare \$86,000, (c) Education: HED \$185,166, and JOM \$78,500.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Legislature of the Ho-Chunk Nation authorizes the above allocations be moved from the Consolidated Tribal Government code for further distribution to the Tribal Priority Allocations of the Nation.
