Permit Terms and Conditions: This permit allows the removal of designated minor forest product(s) for purposes as needed. Applicant or Proxy by signing this understands the Ho-Chunk Nation and its representative are not held liable in the event of personal injury or death, or property damage with Applicant actuating this permit. Responsibility of all actions in accordance with this permit is that of the Applicant. Otherwise use of this permit outside the limits of said permit voids and cancels permit. Applicant understands that material utilization is for cultural or personal use.

Safety: Collecting firewood can be dangerous. Beware of falling trees. When using a chainsaw, keep people and vehicles well clear of the felling area surrounding tree. It is beneficial to the chainsaw operator to wear safety equipment. At a minimum, the operator must wear a hardhat, ear muffs, eye protection, safety boots, and cut-proof pants, as advised by chainsaw operator manuals. It is suggested that the chainsaw operators carry with them tools capable of fire suppression such as a shovel, rake, a firefighting knapsack, a dry chemical fire extinguisher, and axe.

When collecting firewood do not overload your vehicle/trailer beyond the capacity for which it is designed. An overloaded or poorly loaded trailer is unsafe and may cause an accident. Beware of wet or boggy areas where your vehicle might become mired.
